#### Popham, 16th July

# Urchfont, 23<sup>rd</sup> July

Six guns met at the Arms and all piled into Pikeys seven-seater with just about enough room for the guns and ammunition. The chairman sat in the cheap seat at the back and did not complain (much) but, did not want the same seat back. This Sunday was supposed to be shot at Hangmans Stone but they had a competition so the events coordinator, Big Mac, had to find an alternative at short notice. We met him and Spiced in the clubhouse finishing breakfast when we were paying for a hundred bird shoot. The setting for those of you that do not know this Wiltshire shoot is in a sloping woodland with a high tower which can present some quite high and challenging targets. That said, most seemed more challenged by the rabbits and going away clays. This is a lovely shoot but, on this occasion, was poorly managed. No one knew the start time and we waited almost fifteen minutes after the approximate start time stated until we heard the first shot. There were quite a lot of no birds and more than a trap or two that did not work or ran out of clays. There were eight stands but could have been ten, when we asked none of the setting-up crew even knew the number of stands or starting time. As a result, four of our guns ran out of shooting time and only shot ninety. It was not made clear to us at the start that there was such an early cut off time (12.30) and at least half an hour shooting time was lost due to poor organisation of the shoot. The other four guns got around in plenty of time and had very nice bacon and sausage rolls in the clubhouse. There was a short shower of rain but it was not cold and soon dried out again. Well done to Hunter for winning the Sunday 25 cartridges with handicap and to Sturat and Pikey for highest actual 40/50.
