The two lads that set-up were constantly checking things were ok. They were most apologetic about the trap on stand ten which was supposed to throw out a sim-pair. This was by far the best Ower has been for a long time. For the first time since the rules changed about splitting boxes we have an absolute tie. Big Mac and Spiced hit the same number of clays and have the same handicap. Well done to both for winning the Sunday 25s and for both scoring the highest actual 39/50.

Chalky Hill, 8th October

There was a ten-kilometre run which included Moorgreen Road, so not everyone could get to the Arms because the road was closed. There was a good turn-out of eleven guns on this beautiful autumn morning for the fifty-bird layout. Welcome to our new member Soloman, who will not get his handicap until he has shot with us three times. He shot a hundred clays as he had already paid for them and straighted several stands, setting the bar high entering the top-shots league in fourth place. The ground was not as busy as usual and we got round in good time without much queuing. The run was over by the time we got back to the Arms so no beer time was lost. Well done to Badger for winning the cartridges and to Sturat for the highest actual score 46/50.

Petersfield, 15th October

The sun was shining but this was the coldest day we have had for a while. A few ice crystals on the windscreen first thing, raising to 4°C by the time we met at the Arms.
